US EPA Accredited Training in Lead Safety during Renovation, Repair and Painting.

Background: The United States Environmental Protection Agency mandates a certified worker must implement safe guards to limit harmful effects of lead during all renovations of residential and childcare worksites built prior to 1978.

Who should attend: Employees who are responsible for renovations, repairs and painting in homes and structures built before 1978. Property managers who do work on affected buildings must also become certified.

Instructor: Ron Sands conducts employee training in all levels of emergency response, incident command, and an array of other OSHA, DOT and Environmental Protection Agency topics. Ron's credentials include being a certified Lead Paint Abatement Supervisor.
